The extensive typology of available elements combined with perfectly developed comfort, the varied heights of the backrest and armrests, and two types of comfort to choose from are what makes Hillrock a versatile design for all kinds of spaces: from a classic compact sofa in a cosy domestic interior, to asymmetrical multielement arrangements with chaise longues, simple seats for office corridors, to elaborate "micro-environments" for office relaxation areas. Its sculptural form is also ideal for vast hotel

The interesting application of obtuse angles in the modules allows for arranging multi-angular compositions meandering along a number of axes, either free-standing or placed against the wall. 

Modularity, functionality, advanced and wellconsidered typology of elements that offer unlimited possibilities of creating varied sets for public and office spaces – these are the main assets of the Altair sofa system. Its original silhouette is unforgettable. The soft curves of the seat and backrest cushions create a friendly and welcoming relaxation space. Along with consistently planned upholstery details, their rhythm lends the design a distinctive and unique character. The lightweight silhouette that hovers above the ground is emphasised by slender and distinctively shaped legs.

The powder-coated steel parts are available in all colours from the RAL palette and Comforty's Sahara sand structure finishing collection. Combination of different fabrics is optionally available for the upholstered parts: the seat and the internal and external parts of the backrest. Powder-coated steel tables can be optionally ordered with veneered tabletops in the colours from Comforty's veneer collection as well as with marble and Polaris laminate tabletops.

The form of the armchair is sensually experienced through its soft organic shapes that In 2019, one year after the first prototype was appear to hover above the ground. Noble materials are also used, such as solid oak wood, turned in three sizes, used in the carefully sculpted armrests that emanate warmth. A table of solid oak or walnut wood is available in one of the versions. Relative to the proportion of the upholstered components, the steel structure appears almost neutral, unless highlighted with a vivid colour.

shown, we added further variants to the Calder collection. The armchair can be complemented by a bench, which preserves all its comfort parameters, but whose vast plywood backrest evokes romantic orangery furniture, made in the old days of wicker and rattan.

Calder XL is available in several upholstery versions: leather or fabric. With armrests soft and

upholstered, or made of solid oak wood, or else with no armrests at all. The armchair can also come with a useful writing top made of solid oak wood, available to order for right-handed and left-handed users. Colour of the powdercoated, curved, tubular steel frame can be chosen from the RAL palette and Comforty's sand structure lacquer collection, rust, copper and pearl brass.

Calder wood complements the collection initiated in 2018. It combines all the comfort and


with the warmth and timeless beauty of solid oak wood – one of the most noble materials in furniture design. Moreover, it is a sustainable material, whose hardness and processing potential with the use of state-of-the-art technology allow for creating beautiful and unique solutions. The upholstery of the wooden Calder relies on exactly the same forms and plywood elements that are used in other models from the same collection, but the oak base does not repeat the shape of the steel structure. It is a different, more elegant concept that borrows ergonomic qualities of the steel Calder variant from the classic design of the 1950s and 1960s.



The fluidity of the seat and irregular fabric folds turn this version of Oyster into a refined and expressive artefact. The protagonist of the interior, which immediately catches attention. The version with upholstery tightly adjoining the core is enriched with extra cushions for the seat and the backrest. These are permanently sewn to upholstery for the sake of greater comfort. This durable variant of Oyster will perfectly function in public spaces, graced by its impeccable silhouette.

Three versions of the base are available, which allow for matching Oyster to various types of spaces. There is the iconic, steel, tubular base designed by Krystian Kowalski with reference to Teresa Kruszewska's designs; there is the original steel base, also designed by Kowalski, with a 360 degrees memory return swivel; finally, there is the five-point aluminium base, either polished or painted in any colour from the RAL palette. Combined with the two upholstery styles, this offers absolute freedom in arranging a variety of spaces.





The body of the chair can be combined with various base types, depending on the needs. In the most spectacular version, the legs, made of moulded, flame retardant polyester foam, are integrally upholstered with the covering. With the available swivel bases made of moulded aluminium and powder-coated steel, the chair can also be used in office spaces, such as conference rooms and reception areas. Fully upholstered legs turn the chair into a distinctive interior feature, which will perfectly match most types of tables and dining tables.

The Ripple chair is the first fully moulded product in our collection. The innovative technology of immersing its steel structure in a foam mould made it possible to create the distinctive variant with soft, foam legs. The same structure is used to install swivel bases. Even many years on, the complex upholstery of this chair requires an immense effort, exceptional skills and diligence of the most professional upholsterers. In 2019, we improved the comfort of the backrest, which is now definitely softer and better adapts to the body.



Mark is a contemporary authorial vision, and the solutions and details used evoke valuable qualities of Scandinavian design. The beauty of natural wood, prominently featured in the sofa's its relatively low backrest, the sofa does not silhouette, is combined with the contrasting softness of cushions placed on the wooden structure. The composition is harmonious and clearly defined. It seduces with its simplicity and sincerity of the design gesture based on the truth of the material and the function.

Owing to two backrest heights and a well-considered coherence of forms, the Oyster collection, now complete with the high backrest armchair, offers broader possibilities of interior design and arrangement. Individual pieces perfectly complement each other in terms of their function and role in the interior.

Proper backrest height guarantees comfortable support for the head. The optional tilt mechanism allows for relaxing in two ways: with the head resting comfortably slightly tilted backwards or while sitting in a more formal position. Additionally, swivel base versions are equipped with memory return as standard. The collection includes a footstool, which also matches the low backrest armchair versions, and is available in both upholstery styles.

The Comforty collection is distinguished by our collaboration with one of the most influential designers of the 20th century – the late Alessandro Mendini, frequently hailed as the "pope of Postmodernism". Initiated in 2015, this collaboration was Mendini's first experience of work with a Polish brand. Situating his designs for Comforty halfway between tradition and contemporaneity, Alessandro Mendini proposed a collection of versatile wooden items decorated with the ornamental inlay technique. His design taps into the typology of a simple classic

cylinder, a visual trope present in European culture since antiquity. The simplicity and honesty of this gesture are telling. However, it is the sophisticated finishing, the visual motifs rich in details, and the emphasis on the beauty of natural wood textures that reveal the designer's intention.

The modest geometry of the tables becomes a medium to express genuine mastery of craftsmanship.

This product invites associations with contemporary architecture, in which a key role is played by physics and precise mathematical-geometrical calculation. The decorative value and the form come as the result of these factors. Obviously, such approach necessitates as wellconsidered vision and consistency throughout all the stages of product development.

Enjoying unwavering popularity, the Floating series has gained more elements in the course of the years. The collection comprises a sofa,

free-standing armchairs, and corner armchairs that allow for arranging vast corner sofas.

Two types of comfort are available to choose: firm, which is better-suited for public and office spaces, and soft, which is ideal for the home. Visible steel elements are available in colours from the RAL palette. Further customisation is made possible by upholstery, in which choices can be made between contrasting colours of the sofa's sides and seats.










